- ◆ Works to develop a regional Safe Routes to School program
- ◆ Hosts workshops and other events, including:

  - ◆ Regional trail visioning and coordination
  - ◆ Technical trainings

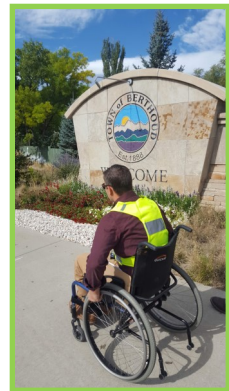

## What is Active Transportation?

- ◆ Human-powered and human-scaled modes of transportation, including pedestrian (walk or wheelchair), bicycle, scooter, skateboard or longboard, etc.

## Active Transportation Plan (ATP)

- ◆ Adopted in July 2021 as an update to our shared regional vision for active transportation
- ◆ Serves as a toolkit for consistent active transportation planning across the region and positions communities to pursue funding opportunities
- ◆ The plan is currently being updated. More information can be found by scanning the QR code



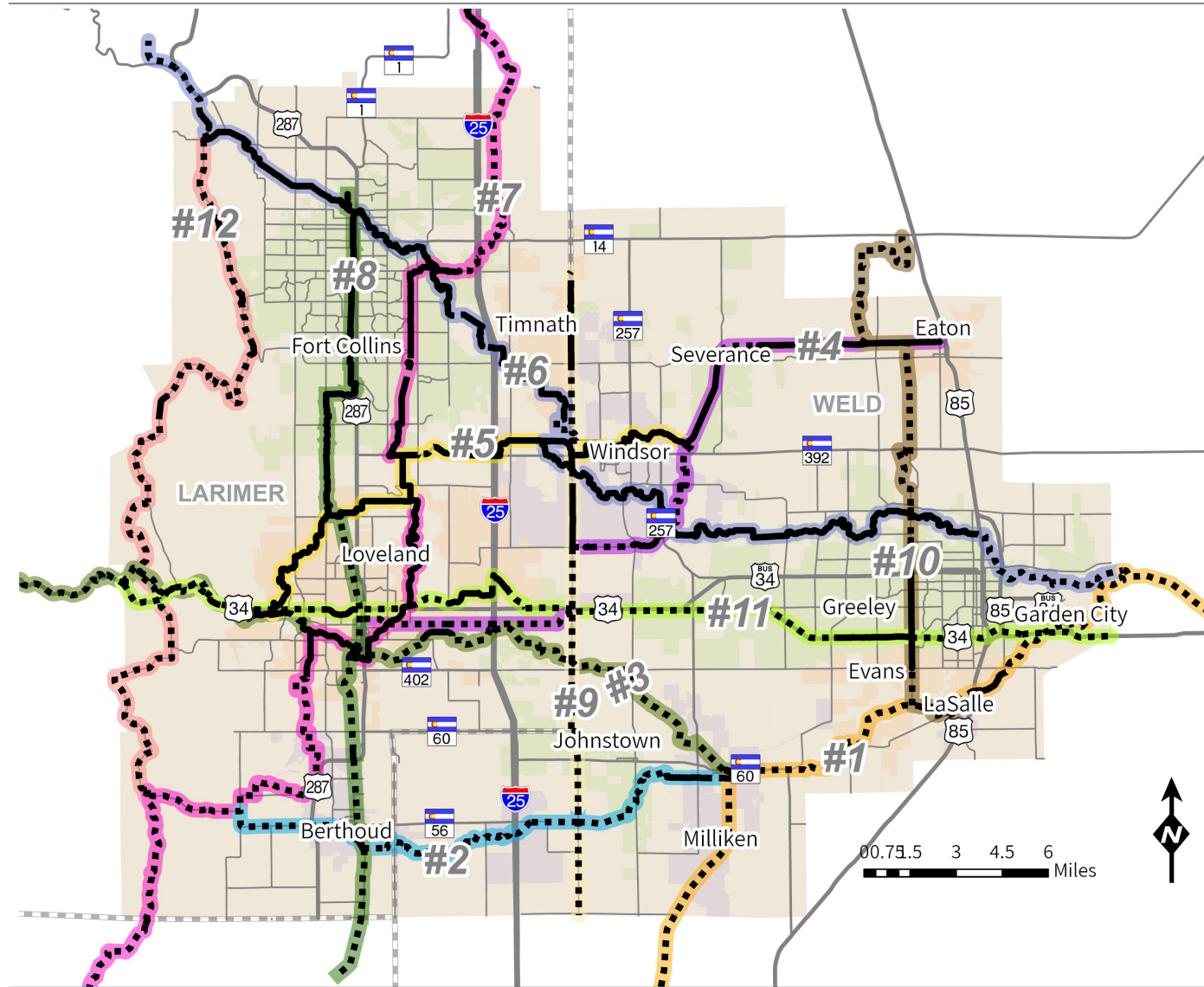
## Regional Active Transportation Corridors (RATCs)

- ◆ The recommended network for bicycle and pedestrian transportation and recreation between communities
- ◆ Developed and updated through a collaborative process
- ◆ Corridors are planned to be completed by 2045

## Safe Routes to School (SRTS)

- ◆ Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is a program that promotes walking and bicycling to school
- ◆ The NFRMPO is working with member agencies to develop a Regional Safe Routes to School Program
